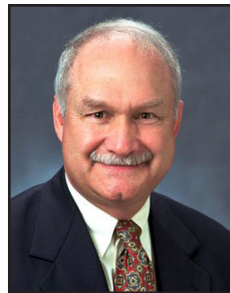

Additionally, attendees will learn what resources are available to clarify these federal initiatives.
